The Collegium Phaenomenologicum will convene its twenty-second annual session at the Study Center of the Università Italiana per Stranieri, located in the Umbrian hills near Perugia. The theme for the 1997 session will be:

Spacing Art *Visibility, Image, Representation*

The Collegium is intended for advanced graduate and postdoctoral students in philosophy and related disciplines. The core of the program is a series of week-long lecture courses, supplemented by individual lectures and intensive text-based seminars, where there are discussions by small groups of students together with individual members of the faculty.
