The Collegium Phaenomenologicum will convene for its thirty-first annual session in the Umbrian town of Città di Castello. The Collegium is intended for faculty members and advanced graduate and postdoctoral students in philosophy and related disciplines. The core of the program consists in a series of lecture courses, individual lectures, and intensive text-based seminars. A Participants Conference will be held July 8-9, 2006.

## Courses and Instructors

The Collegium will be devoted to Derrida's 1968 essay "Plato's Pharmacy" and to the development of many of its themes in Derrida's subsequent works. Courses and lectures will revolve around questions of writing, reading, and technology, psychoanalysis and the family scene, writing and democracy, the pharmakon and khōra, life and the machine, the human and the animal.
